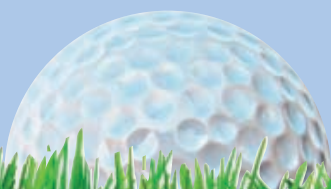

June is always one of the busiest months for Alresford Golf Club and there was much to enjoy this year. Top of the list was our Club Championship Day on Sunday 24 June when the course was in the best of conditions to test our potential champions and, despite some concerns about the weather, the conditions proved to be excellent in all respects. I would like to congratulate our new Club Champion, Jon Fox, on winning the Championship by the considerable margin of 9 shots; a worthy winner indeed. The John Holmes Trophy for the best net score of the day was won by Ashley Wright, with Ben Broadbent just one shot behind and I also add my congratulations to both of them.

The excellence of our course attracted many different visitors during the month of June, notably those professionals who entered the Hampshire PGA Strokeplay Championship which took place the day after our own Club Championship. I heard that on the day, the greens were running just a little quicker than those presented to our championship contenders. Indeed, this event was won, after a sudden death play-off, in a level-par two round total of 138 by Nick Redfern, so the challenge seems to have been maintained for the professionals.

Both of these events were well supported by members who turned up to watch and, in particular, during the closing stages from the comfort of the patio in the late afternoon sunshine when the views from the clubhouse are magnificent.

Other visitors included the 15 club teams who competed for the Triumvirate Trophy on Thursday 14 June. It was won this year by a strong team from Blackmoor who achieved the maximum score of 24 points with Shanklin and Sandown as runners-up. This event, stemming from an idea by Brian Young, is now in its 11th year and, with an excellent organising team of Keith Monkhouse, David Nightingale and David Farr, is simply one of the most popular events in the County. I might be accused of blowing the Club's trumpet but, I can assure you that I am simply repeating the feedback I heard throughout the day and the comments from the team captains who, when it came time to leave, all came up and complimented the Club on the organisation and quality of the event.

The list of other events continues: the Seniors Open followed the next day with a record number of 92 participants and the Mixed Open brought the month to an end with an event which attracted players from

49 different clubs, some from quite distant locations. It is essentially two events followed by a meal with 72 playing in the morning, and another 108 in the afternoon; a magnificent total of 180 players.

It would be remiss of me if I didn't take this opportunity to recognise the tremendous efforts of all the staff who support the success of these events. Steve Privett and his ground staff whose efforts are recognised and talked about throughout the County and beyond - you can imagine the dedication and the number of hours that are put into the course presentation in a week such as this one. At the other end of the operation, after the golfers have played and the Bar Staff have refreshed them, Robbie and Sheena then play their part in delivering excellent meals which enhance the Alresford reputation.

There were many other activities throughout the month including three Men's Matches, against respectively Weybrook Park away and home matches against Hampshire Police and Petersfield, all three of which resulted in victory for Alresford. The result at Weybrook Park was particularly satisfying since this was the first one to be played by the men against this Club. These matches are played as friendlies, with the emphasis on meeting up with other clubs and their members. The season's results to date, therefore, are not the main event but they remain an encouraging played 8, won 7. There are always opportunities for members to participate in the range of friendly matches across the club - a great chance to meet other members and play at other clubs.

On a personal note, I have played my busiest month so far in June including a run of rounds in the week leading up to the Championship when I played 192 holes in 8 days! I enjoyed welcoming the Hampshire Patrons to the Club, playing in their event and then enjoying a most convivial dinner in their company. The Patrons do a great deal to support young professionals in Hampshire and include a number of supporters from our own club and we were very pleased to host them at our club for their AGM. I was also grateful to Ian Swann, the Immediate Past Captain, for his invitation to join with the 21 Past Captains when they competed for the Past Captains' Salver and afterwards share an excellent dinner in their company. I also took a team to Romsey to compete in their Burma Salver and enjoyed the Bigga Golf Club Management Trophy at



a Liphook Golf Club looking in superb condition. Plenty of golf around the county and all in excellent weather, which, as I write, is hardly the appropriate expression!

One other invitation I enjoyed was from Malcolm and his team when I visited one of the "Give Golf a Go" sessions for local school children on the practice area. This is part of the Golf Foundation Scheme where the children work in small groups under the guidance of the Pros, helped on this occasion by Chris Geary, to learn something about various aspects of the game - chipping, pitching, driving and putting. It was Ropley School's turn last week and next week it will be Cheriton Junior School who come to our practice area, all potential golfers in the making – and let's hope in the future that some might end up as members at Alresford.

Finally, I would like to thank all those members who supported the Captains Charity Day by playing on the day or by making personal donations if they

couldn't take part in person. We had over 100 people participating in the pairs competition, taking on the challenge of the score set by Philip Bryden and The Captain. The pair of Neil Flowers and Percy Sim took first place with an outstanding 12 below par round, 6 better than Philip and me, whilst Carole Young and Sue Pearce halved with us and took second place. The day was very successful and was part of fund raising activities both on the day and also those associated with some of our visitor events during the month. A number of other additional contributions from different sections of the club were also gratefully received and helped us to raise a sum comfortably in excess of £1,000 in the month of June. The generosity of club members and our visitors to the Captains' Charity is very much appreciated by the three Captains, Fiona, Roger and me.

Let's hope for better weather through July and beyond for us all to enjoy our golf!

The greens staff are recovering from the long week of hard work before the double “wammy” of the Club Championship on Sunday 24 June and Hampshire IOW PGA Stroke Play Championship, played on the Monday 25 June. They worked 12-hour days the whole week before the Championship and then an extra shift on Sunday afternoon after play to mow the fairways and surrounds again so that there was only the greens to cut in the morning before the Monday PGA Event. Needless to say the course was in pristine condition and many compliments were given on the course and the excellent practise facilities available at Alresford.

Observant golfers will have noticed some of the more established “newly” transplanted trees around the 1st fairway have had the protection removed. They are now “in play” and hence “Relief” from those without stakes or protection is no longer available. Please check each tree individually before playing, as some are still protected!

The continuing wet weather is affecting the bunkers and it is a constant battle to keep them in good order. The

bunker on the 10th hole has a particular issue with water retention and had to be taken out of play for the Club Championship. Discussions are underway on reconstruction and improving drainage as part of the winter programme work.

The areas of rough which are normally mown, are deeper than intended mainly due to the lack of time to cut them. Hopefully given some dryer weather they will be brought back into reasonable control. The triangular area on the left of the 1st hole, between the oak tree on the old 1st hole and the new fairway, has been cut as wayward shots couldn't be seen from the tee and ball searching was slowing up play excessively.

The warm wet weather is generating added problems with fusarium disease on the greens and more frequent applications of fungicide are being made to keep it under control. Generally they are playing well and running at a good speed. **The “Gradon” treatment to the greens will be undertaken again during the week of 6-10 August assuming we get some dry weather!**
