Free Junior Membership for 12-year-olds and under

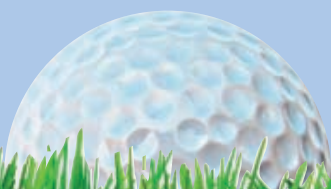

Non-return of your score card will result in disqualification and additionally offenders could also be subject to the same penalty; and for very persistent offenders, the handicap committee is entitled to suspend their handicap which means that as well as being barred from club competitions, they would not be able to compete in any outside events such as opens and other matches.

news from the greens



Not a lot to report this month. Some welcome rain has freshened up the course in time for what will be a period of frenzied playing activity. This includes 15 separate competition days in the month including the Pro-Am, Men's Captain Day and the Ladies Autumn meeting.

Key points to note this month are as follows:

- One of the behind the scenes activities which occupies the management committee at this time of year, is the preparation of the budget. Obviously, cash is a scarce resource and this has to be allocated between all of the various activities of the club. With Greens representing the largest single cost centre, this is not a simple process. Detailed spreadsheets summarising each category such as sand, seeds, irrigation, fertilizer, herbicide, plant, machinery, fuel etc (in total over 25 separate items) have all had to be analysed and built up to arrive at a workable forecast. Again, Steve and his team have to be thanked for all their efforts in achieving this. Greenkeeping in the modern world is not all about driving heavy machinery around – a good working knowledge of Excel is also required!
- Related to this, I should be in a position to report on the planned winter maintenance programme next month - once the Greens Committee has approved it and the budgets are finalised.
- You will see from the club diary that the last week of September is scheduled for Greens Maintenance. I am sure you will all have noticed how quick the greens recovered after the greens maintenance on the 4th August. This was because we only carried out half of the scheduled work as we held back from disturbing the greens too much, because the ladies club championship had been moved to the 19th August, after they were rained off. This only gave 2 weeks of recovery after greens maintenance.

In September, we will endeavour to finish what we did not do at the start of August. This will involve using deeper tines to get down into the soil about 7 to 8 inches. We will of course be topdressing and brushing in sand as always.

The next greens forum will be at 1.00 – 2.00pm on Tuesday the 16th December in the clubhouse bar. If you wish to discuss any specific issue in person, or even just turn up to hear what others are asking. This takes the form of an informal discussion and Steve Privett, myself and other members of the greens committee will do our best to answer any queries and consider any suggestions.

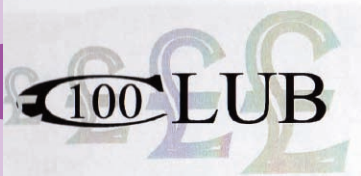
