I am led to believe that by the time you read this, we will be gripped by a heat-wave; although as I write, it seems more like November than June. We even had a frost on May 20th (hopefully the last of the year!), which continued to play havoc with the speed of recovery after Spring maintenance. However, I am happy to report that the greens have indeed now recovered fully – in time for the 125th celebrations and a busy summer of competitions.

Key points to note this month are as follows:

- There will be minimal maintenance on the greens throughout the summer with only regular light sanding and micro-tining. This is in line with our normal summer maintenance procedures and will have negligible effect.
- As regards the speed of the greens, the stimp reading was 10 on Friday the 29th May and then 9.5 on the following day for the EGU medal. These levels will be maintained for the rest of the summer. On some occasions, the speed may increase up to as much as 11, but at anything much beyond these levels, putting downhill on the 2nd, 6th and 16th, can become tricky, to the point of unfair.
- The 125th celebrations will cause a little disruption around the 18th green as a result of the marquee, which will be there for a week. There will be a mandatory free drop for any ball within two club-lengths of any structure related to the marquee and balls must be dropped in the drop zone provided – this is likely to be adjacent to the bomb hole. On the days the marquee is erected and dismantled (Tuesday 9th and 17th), together with Saturday 13th (the day of the 125th Ball) there will, in addition, be a temporary green to protect staff and contractors.
- Staying on this theme, the greens staff will be starting an hour earlier than normal during the 125th celebrations to ensure that there is minimal disruption to all the planned invitational events. Many of you not playing in these competitions and wishing to have an early round, should be aware of the increased workload this week and where possible, give additional leeway to the maintenance machinery.
- We are still awaiting the course design report – hopefully some more news on this in next month's bulletin.

Finally, as we enter into the main playing season and particularly with so many visitors, please continue to remember to repair pitch marks. By repairing a couple whilst waiting your turn to putt, will mean that our greens stay pristine. Remember to push the sides of the depression **in**, rather than lift the depression **up**. The latter technique causes an air pocket, which can kill the roots. Furthermore, spending an extra moment or two raking bunkers properly will ensure that the course will play at its best throughout the day.

Want to know what your committees, including the Management Committee, are doing? — click on *Members Area > Minutes of Meetings* — you'll find minutes of every meeting since 2012. There is a separate link for the Ladies Section too.


As well as all the above, there's a full archive of eBulletins viewable online, the ability for members to submit suggestions or raise issues, plus details on all the reciprocal playing arrangements — including the 23 new "125-Club" reciprocals. Not a member of the 100 Club?

The objective of the Alresford Golf Club 100 Club is to raise funds for projects and items requiring capital expenditure that will enhance the Golf Course and/or the Clubhouse.
